



Christ Jutheran's tory

On Thanksgiving Day, 1926, a Lutheran service was held for the first time at the St. John of Jerusalem Chapel on Wantagh Avenue. The chapel, built in the mid-1800's by local farming families, had gone unused for some time. This new congregation, comprised of a new generation of Wantagh residents, gave themselves the name Christ Lutheran Church. By the early 1930's, a plot of land on Island and Beverly Roads, now Island and Church Roads, was purchased for the building of a larger church, which was dedicated on April 17, 1940. From our beginnings to today, the congregation of Christ Lutheran Church has served Wantagh with grace and love for 98 years.

PROPERTY REPORT – NOV 2024

Our Volunteer Retiree Group continues to perform the maintenance and/or improvement items from the "Office" To-Do list, Seasonal activities, or things reported to us, and we can accomplish without professional help.

Our recent activities have included:

- We continue to move many items for the Thrift shop; Book fairies, Yard Waste, Carmine Bags, Room 2000 racks/tables, garbage bags, NS Toys, repairs, etc.
- We installed an additional Clothing hook on the Room 2000 bathroom door.
- We changed the battery on a slow moving clock in a SS classroom.
- We investigated why the **2000 refrigerator's FREEZER** door wouldn't close properly and uncovered a long container touching the door basket preventing it.
- We adjusted and lubricated the Sanctuary Entrance door to improve TOP latching. Note: To insure proper "Locking", the key must be turned 180 degrees CCW!
- We removed additional coffee stains from the Room 2000 chairs.
- We thank Bill for his shrubbery trimming efforts.
- We "Gently Cleaned" the old **Coffee Spill Residue** from the critical Amphanol Telephone block and connector behind Della's office desk, clearing the not ringing problem on the "**Office telephones**". We firmly secured the connector and dressed up the other wires on the floor. We also Re-Designed and relocated the "wire protection board" to better prevent any future desktop liquid splashover issues.
- We organized the "Tool Time" material in preparation for the fair, setting up the tables and handling the coverage during the fair.
- We responded to a "Hands-free faucet not working" in the main floor ladies bathroom. Testing confirmed the "sensor" was not operating, and we replaced the faucet with a spare on hand. We've contacted the manufacturer for a replacement.
- We re-set the Steinbicker outside stairway light timer and replaced both spot light bulbs with LED's to restore the step's illumination.
- We disassembled the front panel and thoroughly vacuumed the Thrift shop Air Conditioner, We also changed the 2450 battery, and cleaned the filter.
- We **evacuated** the Parsonage lawn and garden sprinkler system and uncovered a broken head which we repaired. We deactivated the garage controller.
- We evacuated the Church sprinklers and deactivated the room 100 controller.
- We uncovered a continuously running toilet in the room 100 men's room caused by broken and jammink parts. We replaced the broken flush lever and leaking stopper to clear the problem. We also replaced the slow acting fill valve.
- We **thank the Eagle Scout project** for replacing the Post and Rail Fencing adjacent the parsonage/parking lot.

NEED RESEARCH FOR POTENTAL LONG RANGE PROJECTS

- * Research the possibility of **new lighting for the Sanctuary**.
- * Research a possible refurbish of the Education Building Main Floor Bathrooms.
- * Research a possible refurbish of the two Room 10 Bathrooms.
- * Research replacing the rear yard Stairway cover. (Scout Project??)
- * Research the possibility and costs to remove and refurbish the Original Steeple Bell and Cradle.
- * Investigate installing a Power Pole in the far Parking lot area, for Security.
- * Research **replacing the Parsonage rear fencing**. (Research who is the owner?)

MISCELLANEOUS THINGS STILL NEEDING WORK

- * Paint the Sliding Closet doors in the Gym South access area.
- * Repair numerous Cement issues. (Walks, Pit wall, Pointing, Washes)
- * Investigate and strengthen the Altar screen Filigree panels which are showing signs of looseness and cracking.
- * Check for loose stair treads on the Room 10 and 20 stairways and re-glue.
- *Arrange to grow grass on the East side of Steinbicker. Stones to pit? Topsoil?, Sod?, Labor. Extend the Sprinkler system into to the area.
- * Rebuild, once again, the weathered Front Sanctuary Planter Boxes.
- * Complete the Painting of the Thrift Shop incoming shed.
- * Replace the Parsonage/Parking Lot "Post and Rail" fencing. (CMPLT)
- * Engineer a "Safety" arrangement for the heavy Organ Speaker loft "Hatch cover".
