PROPERTY REPORT – JAN 2025

Our Volunteer Retiree Group continues to perform the maintenance and/or improvement items from the "Office" To-Do list, Seasonal activities, or things reported to us, and we can accomplish without professional help.

Our **recent activities** have included:

- We continue to move many items for the Thrift shop; Book fairies, Yard Waste, Carmine Bags, Room 2000 racks/tables, garbage bags, repairs, etc.
- We thank Bill for his Ivy removal and shrubbery trimming efforts.
- We Surveyed and advised on the unfinished Parsonage Laundry area. We contacted Quinn for the Water and Gene and Vinny handled drilling the Vent pipe hole and installing the Vent, all ready for the appliance deliveries. Drain issues were referred to the Parsonage renovation committee to resolve.
- At Nicole's request, we boxed up 5 bins of old music, in the Loggia, for the trash.
- We activated the **Advent wreath** on the Saturday after the Thanksgiving service, and deactivated it for Christmas.
- We mounted the eight (8) Boy Scout Christmas Wreaths at the entrance doors.
- Over two weeks, we moved the many Scout cleanup leaf bags to the curb for TOH P/U. We also assisted the TOH to clear out the last bags just before Thankgiving.
- We installed the Sanctuary Entrance "Light Bars" and the ELCA Tree Lights.
- We installed the **Sanctuary Window spotlights**, ready for Christmas Eve services and **re-lamped them with LED bulbs**..
- We installed the South End overhead Sanctuary Wreath.
- We Installed the Sanctuary **Rear Window Wreaths** and the **South End decorations**. We also assembled and placed the **Outside Manger figures**.
- We staged the rear altar Candle stands and installed the Golden Bows. We filled and placed the candles before the Christmas need.
- We finished the decorations by placing the Tree, Manger, and stair garlands.
- We investigated a "Freezing" issue with the small 2000 refrigerator and resecured and set the Thermostat Sensor, dislodged in the recent Defroast activity.
- We managed to get the dark **corner sign to light** one side with a spare bulb/starter swap. We will rewire the two light fixtures to "LED" when the time/weather cooperates.
- We replaced a broken **R/H flagpole light bulb**. A new Socket will be installed when time allows and the weather cooperates.
- We tightened a loose TP holder in the Room 2000 bathroom.
- We sealed-up and winterized the A/C units in room 2000 and the Thrift shop.
- We found the Room 2000 heat on "hold 69°" when we checked the <u>Friday</u> morning after Thankgiving. We suspect it was left on after the Wednesday Thankgiving reception! We reset the thermostat for the week. PLEASE DO NOT PLACE THERMOSTATS ON <u>HOLD</u>. USE THE UP/DOWN ARROWS TO CONTROL.
- We changed the batteries in the **Sanctuary**, **Library**, **Room 10**, **20**, **and 2000** thermostats.

- We continue to find the old entrance doors "UNLOCKED". The last to leave should ensure it is locked by turning the key FULLY 180° Counter Clockwise and check with your thumb. Thank You!
- We filled and staged all the **Sno-melt containers** and activated the **shovels**.
- We removed the Christmas Candelight Service items from storage.

- * Engineer a "Safety" arrangement for the heavy Organ Speaker loft "Hatch cover".
- * Activate, charge, and stage the new "Power Shovel".
- * Touch-up the rust areas of the 10/20 Fire Escape.
- * Check the remote batteries and filters on the office A/C units.
- * Repair and install the window screen in the NS director's office.
- * Repair two Gym tables with damaged legs.
- * Install a new R/H spotlight socket in the spring.
- * Re-Wire the corner sign light fixtures for LED operation.
