They assembled 70 personal care kits which John Eastlund will deliver to the warehouse in Baltimore, MD for the next emergency. A big thank you goes to all the Pioneers who helped.

Gluten-Free Communion Bread

Recipe Provided by Cathy Boyer

Stir together in a large bowl:

- 2.5 cups gluten-free baking blend (Bob's works great; just make sure that what you buy already has some xanthan gum added).
- 0.5 cups buckwheat (despite its name, it's wheat-free)

In a separate bowl, combine:

- 1 cup warm water
- 0.25 cups flaxseed
- 1 tablespoon dry yeast
- 3 tablespoons honey

Let this sit for a few minutes, **until the yeast starts to bubble.** Then, to the same bowl, add:

- 4 tablespoons melted margarine
- 0.25 cups brown sugar
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Add the liquid mixtures to the flour and stir together, adding 0.75-1cup warm water as needed to make a thick batter. Beat on high with electric mixer for three minutes. Cover and let rise in bowl for 30 minutes. Gently move batter to a greased 2-quart casserole pan (I scoop out some batter into 3 or 4 greased muffin cups or small ramekins, to make tiny loaves for homebound Communion distribution, and there is still plenty of batter for the large loaf) and cover to rise another 30-45 minutes.

Bake in a 350-degree oven for about 30 minutes (the big loaf may take 5-7 minutes more after you remove the muffins). Bread will be brown on top and spring back slightly when touched gently in the center. Remove to wire rack and cool completely before removing from the pans.

The large loaf easily feeds 150 people, and my congregation isn't that big, so I sometimes use two 1-quart glass casserole pans instead of the one large loaf, and freeze the spare loaf for next time. The older folks seem to prefer the less crumbly and easier to grasp crust, and the children like the soft center bits that I pinch off for them.

PROPERTY REPORT – SEPT 2024

Our Volunteer Retiree Group continues to perform the maintenance and/or improvement items from the "Office" To-Do list, Seasonal activities, or things reported to us, and can accomplish without professional help.

Our recent activities have included:

- We continue to move many items for the Thrift shop; Book fairies, Carmine, Room2000 racks/tables, garbage bags, NS Toys, etc.
- At Dana's request, we mounted a Bulletin Board in the main floor hallway.
- We set up and secured the **NS rear yard canopy** for the summer, Twice! After it blew over, we refastened it and used cement blocks to keep it down. A massive rainstorm collapsed the entire frame, which we bundled and removed. A new "Sun Screen" lightweight tarp was ordered and installed (NS\$27) to serve the purpose.
- Vinny and Gene completed installing aesthetically pleasing vinyl inserts, and sprayed the rear yard silver fence railings.
- Vinny and Gene responded to another Nursery School entrance door closing issue. They adjusted the closer/latching speeds; which we hope, will resolve the intermittent but ongoing latching issues.
- We engineered, and installed an additional Parsonage sprinkler zone for the Eagle Scout raised beds beyond the parking lot.(PIM\$50)
- We **Re-fastened** the cracked-off **Steinbicker Step End**. We also secured the NS Lawn Sign Base Blocks, to prevent them from dislodging.
- We cleaned all the NS Classroom Wall Fan Blades.
- We installed **two new AED units** and signs, for the 10/20 and Education Buildings. We also **moved the Library AED** unit and sign to the South Sanctuary wall.
- We engineered and moved a front sprinkler head to cover the new Eagle Scout Bench area plantings.
- We installed the window A/C in the NS office and stored the screen.
- Vinny replaced the batteries in one lapel mike after finding it dead.
- Vinny touched-up some paint defects on the Loggia Walls.
- We moved numerous items to the curb for special P/U.
- We removed the **office refrigerator** to the yard and defrosted **the iced over freezer compartment**. After tightening a door hinge, we moved it back inside.
- We activated the Library Heat Pump for A/C and replaced the disintegrated filter.
- We thank Vinny and Gene for arranging the rear yard and Parsonage Apron cement work. (PIM \$2,300)
- We removed and restored numerous heavy items in NS Classrooms and the NS office, in preparation for the new flooring work. We thank Dana and the NS staff for emptying the classrooms of the major items. We monitored the Vinyl flooring installation in three classrooms and the NS office. (NS \$15,525)
- We dismantled the July 4th float sections and stored the parts in the Garage.
- We cleaned the filter in the Thrift Shop A/C unit.
- We **thank Bill Henderson** for trimming the overgrowth around the trees.

- We paint-sprayed the emerging rust spots on the 10/20 fire escape.
- We replaced missing plastic feet on the Tables and Chairs in Rooms 10 and 2000 prior to a surprise property wide waxing project initiated by Council. (PIM/NS \$3,050)
